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INTRODUCTION

The present document, titled Dissemination Plan and Communication Materials, is Deliverable 6.1 (D6.1) within the framework of the rEdESIGN project. This deliverable is part of Work Package 6 (WP6), which focuses on Dissemination, Exploitation, and Communication (DEC) activities. The primary objective of this document is to outline a comprehensive strategy for dissemination, exploitation, communication, and outreach, ensuring that the project's findings and results reach relevant stakeholders effectively and contribute to maximizing impact.

The dissemination strategy is structured to achieve multiple goals, including increasing public awareness of the project, engaging key stakeholders, and ensuring the sustainability of its outcomes beyond the project's lifespan. To achieve these goals, this document details the different communication methods, channels, and materials that will be used throughout the project. Specifically, it covers aspects such as the identification of target audiences, key messaging, dissemination roles and responsibilities, and a range of tools and platforms for communication.

The structure of this deliverable includes several key sections. Firstly, it presents the overall Impact Strategy, emphasizing the significance of dissemination, exploitation, and communication activities in ensuring project visibility and engagement. The following sections elaborate on the Communication and Dissemination Strategy, including defined goals, objectives, and identified target groups. A dedicated section on Communication and Dissemination Activities provides insights into the development of the Communication, Exploitation, and Dissemination Plan (DEC), visual identity, website and social media strategies, project video, and external distribution resources. Additionally, this document introduces an Impact Assessment framework, incorporating key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure the effectiveness of communication efforts. The final sections discuss the Exploitation Strategy, ensuring the sustainability of project outcomes, and Communication and Dissemination Management, which defines roles, approval procedures, and ethical considerations.

Furthermore, this document includes several annexes that provide additional resources and supporting materials essential for the implementation of the dissemination plan. These annexes contain details on the project's visual identity



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(Annex 1), website and social media strategies (Annex 2), and communication materials such as posters, templates, and questionnaires (Annex 3). These supplementary materials are crucial for ensuring a cohesive and effective dissemination approach, supporting the broader objectives of the rEdESIGN project.

This document is instrumental in guiding the rEdESIGN project's approach to knowledge sharing and stakeholder engagement. By implementing a well-defined dissemination and communication strategy, the project aims to foster knowledge transfer, enhance visibility, and support the long-term sustainability of its findings in the field of social economy and social innovation.

This Dissemination, Exploitation, and Communication Plan (DECP) is a specific strategy of communication in order to spread out the results of the project as well as maximizing the key impacts in the relevant targets groups.

This document will develop the different communication topics such as: distribution goals, target audiences (WHO), key messages (WHAT), channels and instruments (HOW) and action plans (WHEN and WHERE). This plan contains also a comprehensive list of Key Project Indicators (KPIs) in order to measure the fulfilment of the objectives.

This document is deliverable 6.1 which is integrated in the Working Package 6 “Dissemination, Exploitation, Communication (DEC)” (WP6) of the REDESIGN project, led by ECTE. This work package will be in action during the whole project, despite the fact that this plan will be submitted in October 2024 and it will be only active since the first quarter of the project.

1. Impact Strategy

The impact strategy determined for REDESIGN project consists of dissemination, exploitation and communication activities, Figure 1. This will boost the impact in the relevant target groups and ensure its continuity beyond the project completion.



Figure 1 Overview of Dissemination, Exploitation and Communication strategy

The main specific objectives related to the dissemination strategy defined for the REDESIGN project are:

- Perform an overview of existing materials (main recommendations and good practices) from previous projects on the issue of social economy and social innovation for the resilience of rural communities
- Identify and sharing of best practices in social economy in the agri-food sector in rural areas in partner countries
- Develop a collaboration network for gathering, for sharing best practices gather a formulating a common key, and learning with focus on boosting the resilience, the greening and the digitalization of social economy enterprises and SMEs active in rural areas.

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- Present best practices in close collaboration with stakeholders via onsite visits to rural SMEs in the social economy and/or hands-on training.
- Understand existing practices and/or challenges of other consortium partners through a set of parallel collaborative sessions (inter-active workshops).
- Develop policy recommendations based on shared good solutions, for building resilience of local rural communities through social economy.
- Stakeholder engagement, for boosting inter-regional learning between social economy stakeholders (public and private sector);
- Maximize the funding visibility and the projects findings with relevant third parties.

In order to focus on the context of this document, it is mandatory to introduce the definitions made by the European Commission regarding the three main aspects of this document.

Dissemination is defined as the practice of open access work. The knowledge gathered and the results are shared to others free of charge for them to use without any other compensation.

Exploitation is defined as the specific use of the project results for commercial, societal or political purposes.

Communication is defined as the promotion of the project actions and results to the relevant target groups.

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2. Communication and dissemination strategy

The communication and dissemination strategy will be clearly determined by the selected stakeholders, which will be mapped by the consortium on deliverable D3.1 (Network Development Documentation) for each partner country.

This mapping will allow the consortiums partners to set a specific range of goals and objectives, as well as determine the key responsibilities of each partner.

Through this section, the goals, the target group and the different roles assumed by the partners in the communication and dissemination area will be outlined.

2.1. Goals and objectives

The key objectives for communication and dissemination are:

1. Increase public awareness of the project's objectives, partners, activities and impact.
2. Ensure the right visibility of the project's actions, results, and influence on society and to ensure the visibility of the EU funding.
3. To investigate the innovative strategies established and will serve as significant areas of focus for the partners in the sphere of education and training.
4. To continually increase REDESIGN's relevance at the local, regional, and national levels by fostering social entrepreneurship in rural areas for sustainable food systems
5. To focus on REdESIGN transnationality, escalating to Europe as a priority, in a later phase.
6. Share the projects results.

2.2. Target groups

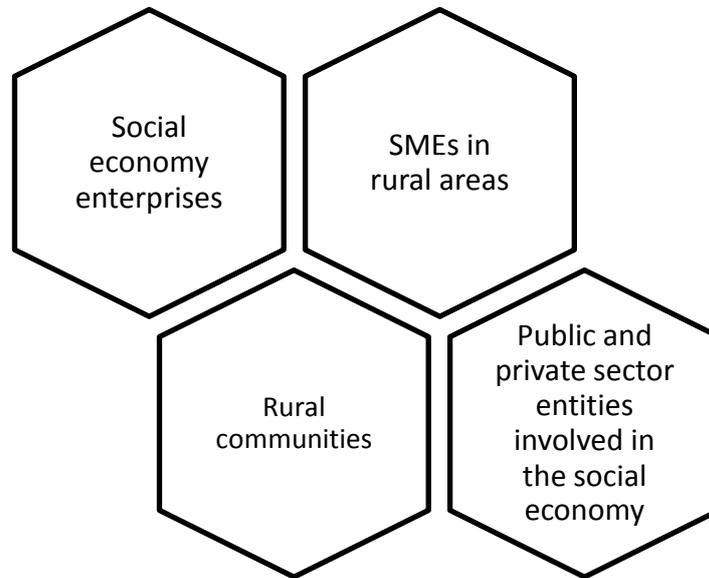


Figure 2: Main target groups identified for the REdESIGN project

The REdESIGN consortium has identified four different target groups, which are displayed on Figure 2. Each partner has gathered all relevant target groups related to its COVE region as well as its previous knowledge or expertise, the result of this mapping task it is synthesized on the deliverable D3.1 "Network Development Documentation".

As Figure 2 shows, there is a wide range of target groups which can be sorted into four main groups: social economy enterprises, SMEs in rural areas, public and private sector entities involved in the social economy and rural communities. Each action will be target group-oriented, making specific actions to fulfil the needs of each of target group.

The consortium consists of seven partners. One Regional government entity (P1), two local government bodies, municipalities (P5 and P6), one Chamber of Commerce (P3) who is also acting as training provider in VET and educational provider HE, one VET provider (ECTE) (P2), one developmental agency (P4) and one structural developmental body (P7), acting as an associate in the consortium. This variety of partners will enhance the project scope, enabling to reach all the designated target groups with the partners' communication networks.

2.3. Dissemination roles

The wide variety of partners involved will allow distributing the communications task between them in order to have a balanced role and contribution matrix considering the specific expertise of each partner. The specific role is displayed in Table 1.

3. Communication and dissemination activities

REdESIGN dissemination strategy and activities ensure that the project outcomes, i.e., concepts, scientific results, methods, and established tools, are widely disseminated to the appropriate target audiences.

In this way, a series of communication and dissemination actions are planned to promote project activities/results and optimize the impact of the REdESIGN project, as outlined in WP6. Furthermore, all dissemination channels have been chosen bearing in mind the effectiveness of the methods and the sort of message to be conveyed and the characteristics of the target groups take into consideration.

3.1. Development of Communication, Exploitation and Dissemination Plan (DEC)

The first step of communication strategy is to set the range of tools, distribution goals, messages and methods to organize the communication phase of the project. To achieve this goal, a Dissemination, Exploitation and Communication plan (DEC plan) will be established. This plan is developed in this document which is the first deliverable of Work Package 6 which lasts from the beginning until the completion of the project, and it is led by ECTE.

Table 2 displays the different tasks related to the communication phase, responsible, the schedule to follow and the deliverables associated to the different tasks.

3.2. Visual Identity

This task involves the development of a project website, establishment of a visual identity (e.g., logos, branding), and the creation of communication materials (e.g., brochures, presentations) that support effective communication and outreach efforts.

Purpose: The purpose is to provide an online presence and professional communication materials that facilitate information access and engagement with the project's objectives and outcomes. This work is part of the task 6.2 and will be led by ECTE

3.3. Website and social media

The project website and social media will play a key role in the dissemination process. Each partner will promote the project through their own channels as well as through the consortium channels.

ECTE will be the leading partner for this task. The website will be the main portal to promote REDESIGN and demonstrate its potential importance through its prime targets and where the interested parties and the public can find out details about the project, the consortium partners, the planned activities as well as their progress and results;

Digital media, particularly the project website and social media, will be critical for promoting REDESIGN. The REDESIGN will have its own website, as well as a social media profile (to be agreed upon by consortium members) in addition to the consortium members' own channels (website, social media, newsletter, etc.). The online dissemination plan includes the following elements:

- A project website.

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- Publishing project-related information on the project's partners' websites
- Disseminating project-related information using social media.

3.4. Project video

A professional project video will be produced with the objective of motivating target groups and making social economy businesses attractive. The video will include successful and motivating stories from good practices in social economy.

3.5. External distribution resources

A number of dissemination tools will be used to ensure the adequate coverage of the target audiences, these tools can range from newsletters and press releases to technical articles.

Throughout the development of the project, the partners are expected to present REDESIGN, its methodologies and results at relevant conferences, workshops, and fairs. In this way, external distribution resources that will be used on a regular basis:

REDESIGN will also produce a newsletter biannually and issue press releases during the project to reach the target audiences and vary the external communication channels.

Every consortium partner will reach out the relevant stakeholders through social networks (X, LinkedIn, or Facebook). Also, traditional sources will be used such as local newspapers, local radio channels.

4. Impact Assessment

4.1. Introduction

The project is expected to have the following impact:

- Increasing better, high-quality employment (tackling unemployment in rural areas);
- Supporting the green, social, and digital transition at a local level;
- Supporting resilient and sustainable business models based on social economy;

4.2. Communication and Dissemination Follow Up

The monitoring of communication and dissemination activities is crucial to ensure maximum outreach of the project and future uptake of results. Therefore, the performance in the project's social media channels and website will be assessed quantitatively in regular intervals (i.e. biannually). In this way, the effectiveness of the Communication and Dissemination activities will be monitored according to a set of Key Performance Indicators, as in Table 3.

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For workshops and other events organised by REDESIGN, the number of participants will be recorded, and questionnaires will be used to qualitatively assess participants' satisfaction.

4.3. Communication and Dissemination after the project's end

It is worth mentioning emphasize that the consortium will continue to develop proportionate and sustained dissemination activities after the project is finished, including:

- Updating the website by adding new content.
- Publishing news on social media at the appropriate time.

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5. Exploitation strategy

5.1. Introduction

Exploitation Strategy is necessary to capitalise knowledge and technology developed throughout the lifespan of the project. This section aims to present REdESIGN's key exploitable results and to identify potential fields for exploitation beyond the end of the project.

This Exploitation Strategy outlines the potential and opportunities for commercial, political, scientific, educational and societal exploitation of the REdESIGN methods and tools (e.g. evidence-based data, scientifically validated research, real-life testing, etc.) and identifies ways to maximise the impact of REdESIGN across the stakeholder involved.

The REdESIGN consortium is fully committed to ensuring the sustainability and optimal exploitation of the project results. The exploitation strategy aims at properly transferring knowledge to the targeted sectors driving several practical applications and recommendations, both directly and indirectly.

The exploitation plan of the project results will be defined for each of the potential users. Each type of user will require an exploitation plan adapted to its market, as each has its own means of purchase and distribution.

5.2. Objectives for Exploitation (EO)

In terms of exploitation, the REdESIGN project's primary objectives are:

- EO 1: To investigate the innovative strategies established and will serve as significant areas of focus for the partners in the sphere of education and training.
- EO 2: To continually increase REdESIGN's relevance at the local, regional, and national levels.
- EO 3: to focus on REdESIGN transnationality, escalating to Europe as a priority, in a later phase.

5.3. Exploitation Activities (EA)

Exploitation activities will begin at the beginning of the project alongside the initial dissemination phase, allowing the identified stakeholders to be a part of the process

and later adopt the exploitable results of REDESIGN and participate in the actions of the Stakeholders engagement Plan (T3.4).

5.4. Planning for Exploitation (EO)

A dissemination, exploitation, and communication plan (DEC, T6.1), will be prepared during WP6 with an emphasis on examining the results obtained at the appropriate time and allowing full permitted use of the created knowledge and tools. The utilization of the project's results will fall within the purview of the Dissemination Manager (DM). The following responsibilities of the DM are related to exploitation:

- Propose an exploitation strategy and related updates.
- Coordinate and carry out exploitation efforts.
- Create the exploitation master plan, by assisting the partners in creating suitable sub-exploitation plans ensuring that the outcomes are properly used.

5.5. Exploitation and follow up

A set of Key Performance Indicators, as shown in the table below, will be used to track the effectiveness of the Exploitation activities:

5.6. Exploitation after the project's end

The development of a Stakeholders engagement Plan will include a Long-Term action (T3.4) with structured actions to allow the full use by stakeholders. Therefore, it is predicted that produced knowledge would be exploitable.

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6. Communication and dissemination management

6.1. Roles and responsibilities of the partners

According to Article 17 of the Grant Agreement on “Communication, Dissemination and visibility”, all partners/beneficiaries must promote to communicate and disseminate the project and their results:

“The beneficiaries must promote the action and its results by providing targeted information to multiple audiences (including the media and the public), in accordance with Annex 1 and in a strategic, coherent and effective manner. Before engaging in a communication or dissemination activity expected to have a major media impact, the beneficiaries must inform the granting authority.”

All partners are therefore expected to proactively seek out opportunities for communication and dissemination, as well as to contribute to such efforts of the Consortium.

ECTE is leading WP6 and thus coordinating the communication, dissemination and exploitation activities. Each partner contribution to the different task schedule for WP 8 are showed in Table 2.

This includes activities at the project and consortium level, guaranteeing consistency in the messages delivered and ensuring all the communication targets are effectively achieved. However, all partners must contribute to the implementation of the Dissemination, Exploitation, and Communication Strategy and play a key role in networking with stakeholders. The partners will have to work together to share information and research results in optimal ways for greatest impact.

Partners are asked to regularly report on their communication and dissemination activities.

Each partner will have different dissemination and communication responsibilities according to their role and area of expertise, throughout the project, Activities may include editing and ‘translating’ academic and scientific materials into more accessible materials, providing background information or fact-checking material.

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6.1.1. Acknowledgment of EU funding (Visibility- European flag and funding statement)

All communication activities of the beneficiaries related to the action (including media relations, conferences, seminars, information material, such as brochures, leaflets, posters, presentations, etc., in electronic form, via traditional or social media, etc.), dissemination activities and any infrastructure, equipment, vehicles, supplies or major result funded by the grant must acknowledge the EU support and display the European flag (emblem) and funding statement (translated into local languages, where appropriate):



Figure 3. European flag and funding statement

The emblem (Figure 3) must remain distinct and separate and cannot be modified by adding other visual marks, brands or text. Apart from the emblem, no other visual identity or logo may be used to highlight the EU support. When displayed in association with other logos (e.g. of beneficiaries or sponsors), the emblem must be displayed at least as prominently and visibly as the other logos.

6.1.2. Disclaimer excluding Agency Responsibility

Any communication or dissemination activity must feature the following disclaimer (translated into local languages where appropriate):

“Co-funded by the European Union. Views and opinions expressed are however those of the author(s) only and do not necessarily reflect those of the European Union or [name of the granting authority]. Neither the European Union nor the granting authority can be held responsible for them.”

6.2. Procedure of Approval within the Consortium

6.2.1. Scientific and technical publications

According to the “Specific Rules” section of the Grant Agreement (Annex 4), all partners are required to give at least 15 days advance notice to the other partners

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before disseminating results. They must also provide sufficient information on the results they are planning to disseminate. Any other, beneficiary may object within 15 days of receiving notification if they can show that its legitimate interests in relation to the results or background would be significantly harmed. In such cases, the results may not be disseminated unless appropriate steps are taken to safeguard those interests.

6.2.2. Communication materials

All partners will produce a variety of communication materials, such as brochures, videos, articles, interviews, social media posts, etc, during the project. These communication materials require a different approval procedure compared to scientific articles, as they do not contain detailed IPR relevant issues.

The project coordinator will be reviewing and approving the materials before printing or publicising them.

For official REDESIGN press releases, approval will be required from the coordinator and those quoted in the press release (if applicable). Press releases from the partners will be under the responsibility of these partners and do not require official approval from the coordinator, although it is strongly advised to notify ECTE about these press releases to coordinate communication efforts.

For journalistic articles and interviews, only the partners mentioned in the publications will be required to fact-check and/or approve the content. No official approval from the Consortium is foreseen.

Interference by involved parties would be counterproductive for the distribution success and the journalistic nature of these publications.

No approval is needed by ECTE for social media posts done on the project's social media channels.

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7. Ethics

7.1. Overview of the documents analysis

The preliminary analysis of the project objectives and planned activities has led to the conclusion that the ethics issues tackled by the REdESIGN project can be divided into two main categories:

- Related to the project activities:
 - Involvement of human participants
 - Personal data processing (including potentially sensitive data)
 - Open Calls (OC)/FTSP projects ethics and legal compliance guidance/monitoring
- Related to the technologies/results:
 - Development/use of technologies potentially affecting privacy
 - Development/use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) technologies

In addition, the issue of safety both with regards to the project activities and their participants as well as to the future user of the technologies developed and/or applied in the project was identified.

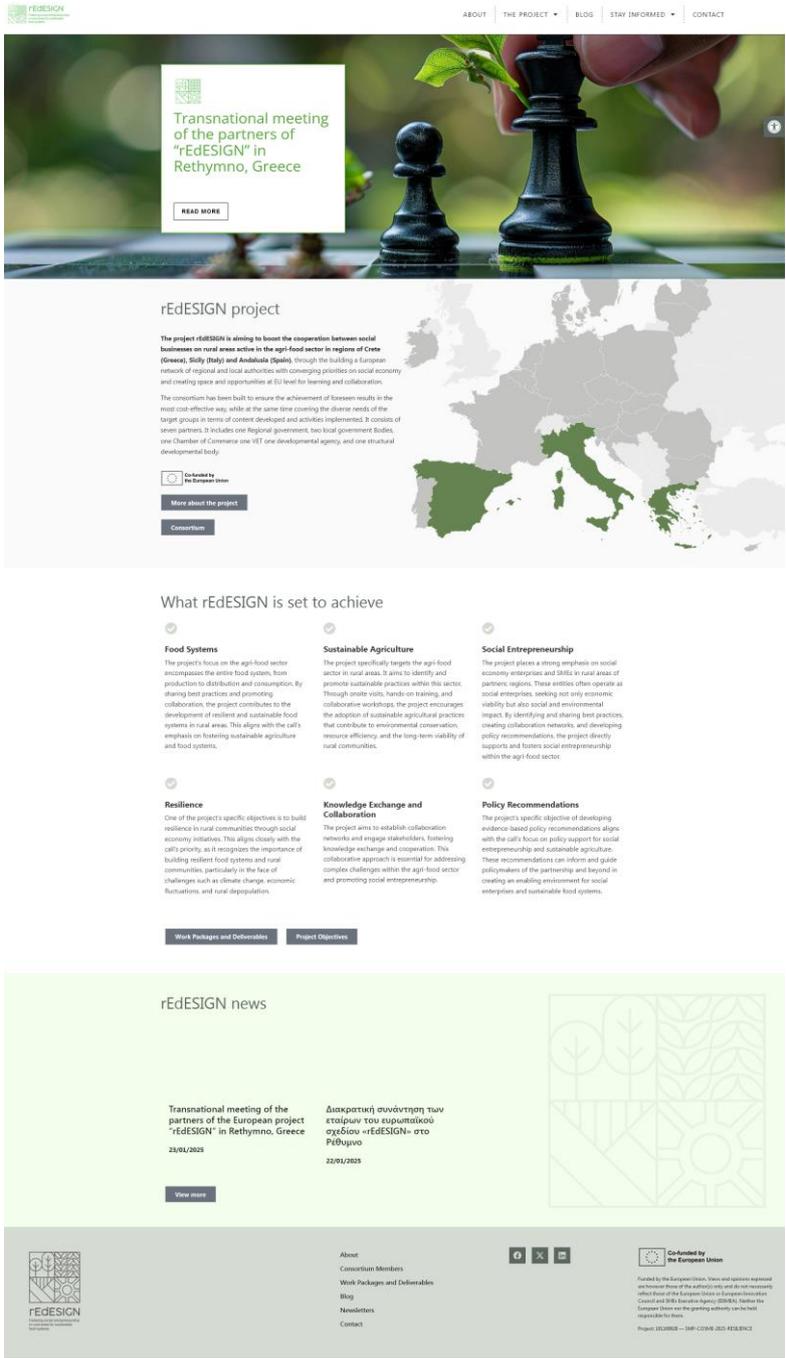


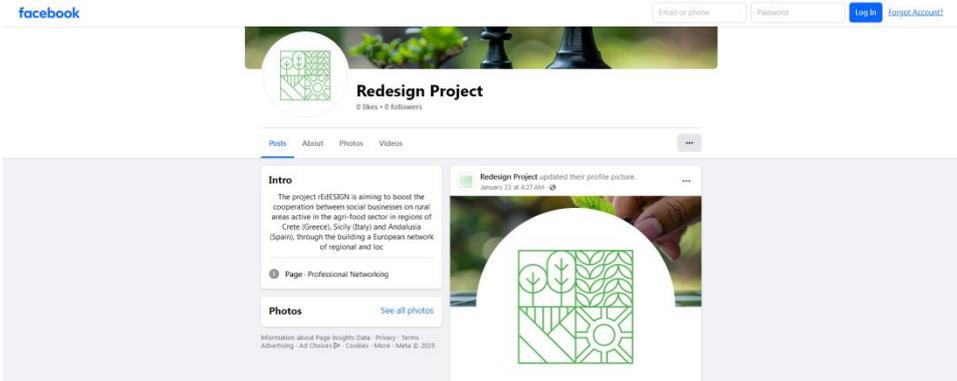

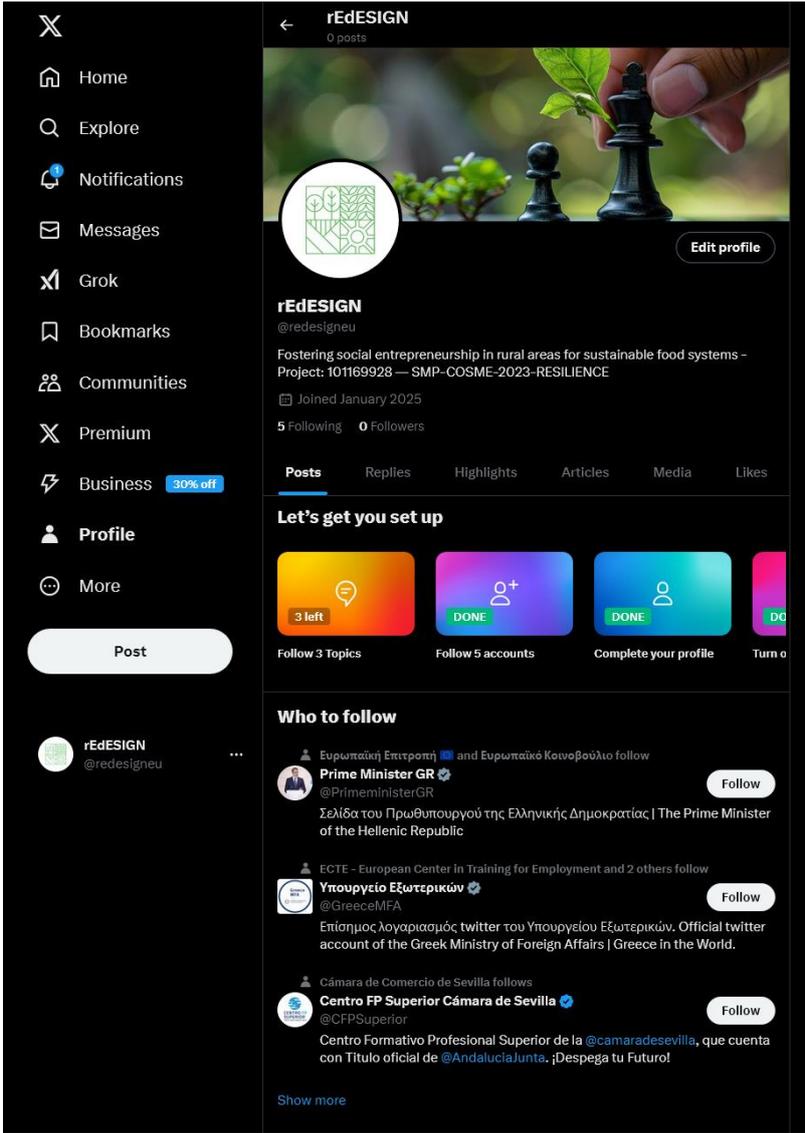
